- Risk Management
- BeyondCorp / Zerotrust models in practice
- Privacy and Anonymity
- Identity & Access Management
- Focused Security Research (Visualization, IoT, Vehicles, Toys, Web apps, etc)

Even if your talk doesn't fit perfectly into one of these categories but seems like it fits within the idea of the conference, please submit for consideration! This list is simply suggestive of the kinds of things we're looking for... feel free to expand our horizons!

## Conference format

BSides Idaho Falls has two, concurrent main tracks, and talks should fit into a 60 or 20 minute timeslot (meaning a 15 or 50 minute presentation is expected). Presenters will be positioned in front of the crowd and will present using normal audio/visual equipment.
